OMS NZ is looking to the future by sowing the harvest with mission trips designed to develop our future leaders.

We will provide the necessary training for those going and leading internationally. You will have OMS NZ's global network supporting you, and you will have the resources you need.

A Call to Action: I am reaching out to those with a heart to serve—those who are retired, those who can mentor, the pastors, and those of us who can say, "Follow Me." The BIG question is, will you answer the call?

We have an incredible opportunity to shape the future of our mission and to ensure that our legacy continues through the next generation. Christianity In Global Perspective Event.

Have you ever thought about trends in global christianity? What about the impact of women in christianity? These are certainly two things I hadn't really thought about before, until July.

Missions Interlink hosted an event called 'Christianity in Global Perspective' with guest speaker Dr. Gina Zurlo (Ph.D). She is a world renowned Christian demographer, historian, and was named one of the BBC's 100 most influential and inspiring women of 2019.

Gina is the co-director of the Centre for the Study of Global Christianity, where she helps edit the World Christian Database. She is also a Visiting Research Fellow at Boston University's Institute on Culture, Religion and World Affairs, where she edits the World Religion Database. So clearly, she is extremely knowledgable in her field!

I thought I'd share a few interesting facts I learnt and felt quite challenged by.

TRENDS IN CHRISTIANITY:

- * David B. Barrett was the first person to count all religions across the globe. He spent the 1960s and 70s travelling to 212 countries collecting data!
- * The 3rd edition of the 'World Christian Encyclopaedia' was published in November 2019, which Gina also helped put together. She was also chosen to present a copy to the Pope.
- * In 1900, 82% of Christianity was located in the North (Northern America and Europe with 460 million people). Where 18% percent was in the South (Latin America, Africa, Asia, Oceania with 99 million people).
- * In 2020, 33% of Christianity was in the North (833 million people) and 67% was in the South (1,686 million people).
- * Currently Africa is leading for future Christianity. What are they doing that Western Christians can do better?

WOMEN IN WORLD CHRISTIANITY:

- * Demographics have estimated that the majority of Christianity is female everywhere in the world.
- * Yet there is a chronic lack of data on gender in World Christianity. Because of this, in 2019, Gina began a new project studying women in world Christianity.
- * In an article co-written by Gina that was published in June 2024, it is stated that "Women have been utterly critical for the growth and survival of movements in the face of competing religions, persecution, and shifts in political power. There would be no twentieth-century shift of Christianity to the global South, nor its tremendous numerical growth, without women working as indigenous evangelists, raising their children in the faith, and spreading the message of Jesus among their local networks."

We are thankful Gina was able to take the time to visit New Zealand and share her knowledge with us! If you're interested in hearing about her work, she has a lot of videos on Youtube as well as podcasts online.

10 Ways You Can Serve In Missions

Do you feel like you're not called to missions or maybe you just don't have time? Well, when Jesus shared with us with the Great Commission, it wasn't a commandment for just some of us, but for all of us. Missions can be done in many different ways, and doesn't always require you leaving your family and heading overseas.

Here are 10 ways that you can serve in missions (some of which may surprise you):

1. Start a missions corner in your church

Do you currently have a display in your church that is catered for missions work? Having a missional display is a great way to share news of local and global work where sharing the Gospel is a priority. As missions is a central theme in the Bible, it should also be a focus in our churches.

2. Join a club/night class

This can be in your school, university or in your local area. Joining a club or a night class can be a great way to learn a new skills and meet new people. These new connections can provide opportunities to practice local missions and share about the Gospel.



3. Start networking

Venture out into different organisations that work to spread the Gospel. You will meet so many different people who are doing mission work in unique ways, therefore gaining a greater understanding and knowledge of local and global missions.

4. Invite people to speak

Now that you've met a number of new people through networking, invite them to share! This can be done anywhere, in your church, small group, or events that you hold. In this way, we can share ideas and support each other.

5. Be a volunteer gardener

This is a terrific way to help your neighbours. Mission work isn't just talking about how to do it, but actually putting our words into action: serving as Jesus served by helping those in need. An added bonus of this is that you're helping look after God's creation, taking care of His garden.

6. Support missionaries prayerfully and financially This is an oldie but a goodie. One of the best things we can do for missionaries is to pray for them. They are a group on the front lines of battle, so we must help provide the spiritual protection that they need. Donating financially is also an extremely helpful way to contribute to the Kingdom. The money you donate helps churches get built, ministries get started and sees lives changed.

7. Join a short-term mission

Maybe you're thinking of dipping your toes into the mission field? A 2-3 week trip can be a real eye-opener, testing your flexibility, your dependence on God and showing you how you can use your giftings in new ways. We have terrific opportunities for short-term trips; check them out on our website, oms.org.nz.

8. Invest in a mission project

As well as supporting individual missionaries, there are opportunities to support certain ministry projects. A few opportunities through OMS NZ include the Caleb Institute in India and the Moscow Seminary in Russia, seminaries that teach theology in relevant and practical ways. We also



partner with Homes of Hope in Fiji, the Mangyan ministry in the Philippines, and the OMS camps in Spain and Hungary. HOPE61, our human trafficking prevention ministry, is also an excellent project to get behind. Countless lives are being changed through these ministries, and with your help, we can do even more!

9. Host fundraisers

Perhaps you have a knack for putting together and hosting fabulous fundraisers? There are so many opportunities to raise money for missions work, whether it be supporting a missionary, a mission project, organisation, or helping send passionate individuals on a short-term mission.

10. Consult with God on all things

I left the most important item for last. The best way to serve in missions is to ask God for guidance. Without Him, everything else on this list would be pointless. God was the first to do mission work, so naturally following His example and asking for His advice is the way to go.

After all, the heart of missions is to bring Jesus to those He came to save.
